AUXILIARY PROBATION SERVICE

Auxiliary Probation Officers (APO's) - Supervise unruly and delinquent children who are placed on court-ordered probation. APO's work in the homes and schools of probationers allowing officers to assist children, their families, and educators with rehabilitative, family and educational issues. APO's are trained and become sworn officers of the Court upon successful completion of training. You select the area of Shelby County you want to work.

SPECIAL SERVICES AUXILIARY

Ambassador - Got marketing and public relations skills? Come volunteer for this elite group who perform various duties to assist the Court including greet visitors in the main lobby, and representing the Court at public events and activities throughout the community. Must be people oriented with a caring spirit. Training and uniform provided.

Chaplaincy - The Chaplaincy Program provides churches, and faith-based ministries weekend visits to minister to the children currently in Juvenile Court Detention.

G.O.A.L. Program - This program gives volunteers a chance to interact directly with children who are currently being held in Juvenile Court's Central Detention Center through daily classes on relevant and beneficial topics. You can provide the children an opportunity to learn things about themselves and hopefully make better choices in life. Classes meet Monday through Friday, from 9-10am (Girls), and 10-11am (Boys). You can select when you work.

Interpreters - Bi-lingual? You can assist the Court, attorneys, juveniles and their families with multi-cultural communications; also assist with tours of the Court, and other special projects.

Project Specialist - Serve as a trained tour guide of the Court, assist with clerical projects in Volunteer Services, work on "The Volunteer Voice", our bi-monthly newsletter, or use your skills to help in the Detention Library.

All volunteers must be 21 years old (some opportunities available for 18 - 21 year old), must pass interview, NCIC Criminal Background Check, Sex Offender Registry Check, Vulnerable Person Registry, and fingerprints are taken and registered with local, state, and national law enforcement to protect the children we serve.
